Lesson 5 – Prayer

Christ the King feast day is November 22

Parents, the best way for a child to learn something is repetition, repetition.

Introduction: Prayer is talking and listening to God. There are different types of prayers.

Activity	Link/Activity
Review	What did God make? (everything) How long did it take God to make everything? How do we know God love us? God's rules are called the Ten Commandments. What is it called when we disobey God? God will forgive us.

Discussion/ Questions	Prayer is talking to and listening to God. When do you talk to God? Do you pray in the morning when you wake up? Do you talk to God about your day before you go to bed? Do you pray before you eat a meal? You can pray to God at any time! Some people pray together as a family. Others take some time to talk to God alone. In the morning, you can thank God for a beautiful day. Before you get out of bed say, "Thank you God for this morning. Please stay with me all day long! I love you!" You can ask God for help during the day. Here is an example: "Jesus, please help me to be nice to others. One person keeps teasing me. Please help me to treat others with kindness." You can praise God at any time of the day. You might say, "God, you are so wonderful! You care for us so much!"

	If you do something wrong, you can tell God you are sorry. Try saying something like this: "God, I made someone sad today. I was very mean. I told someone in my class that he could not play with us. I am very sorry. Tomorrow I will try to act with more kindness."

Say grace before each meal. Pray before going to bed. Incorporate pray into as many key points of your day as you can.
